1 Answer: **a**

No, you decline the request and block/ tell a parent/guardian/ teacher if it's made you feel uncomfortable or worried.

2 Answer: **b** or **c**



If someone sends you an upsetting message online, you should never reply straight away. Take a break from your screen to calm down and ask an adult for advice if you need to. If you feel comfortable you might want to report or block them.

3 Answer: **c**



There are risks talking to people you don't know online. You should never video call or speak to someone you don't know online without talking to your parent or carer about it first.

4 Answer: **a** or **b**



You should never include any personal information in videos you post online. It might make it easier for people you don't know to find out information about you.

Only share your TikTok videos with people you know from school or other offline activities. Make sure to always watch your video back before you post it. Check that it doesn't include information like names, locations and school uniforms.
